APPEALS SELF HELP CLINIC 2018 REPORT

In 2018 the clinic assisted 181 people. This is a 29% increase from 2017. 27 of those attended the clinic via telephone. 80% of the customers were seeking an appeal to the Court of Appeals. Detailed data are listed below. Last year 25% of all appeals to the Court of Appeals involved at least one unrepresented party. In family law cases, the number was 47%.
