

UNEMPLOYMENT APPEALS SELF HELP CLINIC 2023 REPORT

In 2023 the clinic assisted 34 people. (Two people attended more than once.) The clinic continued to be held only by telephone. In 2023 cases with at least one pro se party constituted 87% of unemployment appeal case filings. There were a total of 54 unemployment cases filed in the Court of Appeals (a 41% decrease from 2022).

Clinic Details

Typically, the clinic operates twice per month. Clinic customers speak with volunteer attorneys for approximately 30 minutes. Prior to calling the customer, the attorney reviews both the customer's initial decision from the unemployment law judge and the decision in response to the request for reconsideration.

Number of Appeals Filed

18 of the clinic customers (53%) decided not to file an appeal after consulting with the clinic attorney.

Clinic Customers Who Received Full Representation

Four customers were referred to the Pro Bono Pro Bono Appellate Panel (MSBA Appellate Practice Section).

In April 2013, the Minnesota State Law Library and the Labor and Employment Section of the MSBA started a free clinic for people contemplating an appeal to the Minnesota Court of Appeals from an agency denial of unemployment benefits. The clinic is staffed by volunteer attorneys and law library staff.
